

Churches United Giving Tree at MLC

Milnor Lutheran's stewardship focus currently is Churches United, an organization in Fargo-Moorhead that provides help for today and hope for tomorrow to people in need. Read on to learn more about this amazing source of blessing in this area.

Churches United

Founded in 1987, Churches United is a non-profit that was started by a group of local churches and faith communities to support community by addressing the rising homeless crises in the area. We provide shelter, support, and case management services for families, men, and women. We are open to people of any faith or non-faith guests. Our mission is to provide safe shelter, stable housing, nutritious food, and a path toward healing for our neighbors in need.

We strive to move residents from shelters to stable housing as quickly as possible. All those experiencing homelessness have case managers who help guide them into safe and affordable housing, access to two full-time shelter nurses, and the support of advocates who help provide for daily needs such as diapers, laundry detergent, hygiene products, and a listening ear as they adjust to community in the shelters and apartments.

Originally, Churches United was one site. In 2018, CU joined with Dorothy Day and now has 6 sites.

- Micah's Mission Shelter and Community Center (shelter for men, women, and families) -This is the only shelter in the area that houses male-headed families and does not separate the father from the family
- Dorothy Day House (shelter for men)
- Safe Haven (shelter for unaccompanied women)
- Bright Sky Apartments (permanent supportive housing)
- Dorothy Day Food Pantry Moorhead (choice model pantry)
- Dorothy Day Food Pantry West Fargo (food distribution site) -We just moved this pantry to a new location in West Fargo and it is the largest fresh food pantry in ND
- Silver Linings Apartments (permanent supportive housing for seniors 55+)

Between the 6 sites, CU serves about 425 people every single day. We will open a 7th site - Silver Linings Apartments (permanent supportive housing for Seniors) in 2022.

Some statistics: In 2020, there were 19,178 different households helped by our food pantries, 1.6 million pounds of food was distributed at the pantries, 769 unique individuals who used our shelters, 2,197 client appointments with our Shelter Nurse, and a total of 19,989 night guests who slept at our shelter.

A gift list of needed items for Churches United is on the last page of this newsletter. Unwrapped gifts should be delivered to the church by December 19 and placed in the tote in the entry.
