MLC Church Council Decision Regarding Resuming Worship on June 7th!

On May 26 the Council met (via telephone) to once again discuss resuming worship services. With no active cases of COVID-19 in Sargent County, the council decided to start services again on June 7 at 9:30. If you don't feel comfortable coming back at this time, we understand and will continue to miss you. If you are ready to worship together again, we welcome you and share these guidelines:

*Thoroughly wash hands at home. A limited amount of hand sanitizer is available in the narthex. Bringing your own supply will be helpful.

*Masks are strongly suggested. Due to high demand, masks will not be provided. Please bring your own.

*Only the main entrance will be accessible. It will be propped open (weather permitting) before and at the close of the service. Restrict bathroom usage to the bathrooms in the fellowship hall.

*Bulletins will be available, spaced apart, in the narthex. Take them with you after the service.

*Hymnals have been removed from the sanctuary and stacked in the narthex. Choose your hymnal(s) to use during this worship service (and future services) and to mark your self-assigned seating in the sanctuary. Use a sticky note to attach your name(s) to your chosen hymnal(s). Next, be seated while socially distancing at least six feet from other members.

*For safety there will be no greeting, ushering, physically sharing the peace or coffee fellowship, no Holy Communion at this time. Shepherding Families have been asked to invite readers. To help keep the Bryant household safe, Rick will not greet members after the service.

*The offering plate will be on the piano. Offering may be placed there before or after worship, or done online.

*When the service is over, social distancing should be practiced. Please leave the church directly. Visiting may be done outside at safe distances.

*Please do not attend worship if you have any type of illness or symptoms of COVID-19.

CDC guidelines have been modified recently with the most concern being centered on transmitting the virus orally. It appears "droplets" can remain in the atmosphere for some time and six feet distancing is a bare minimum. For that reason we strongly encourage the use of masks. For that reason we are excluding singing at this time. Discussion continues on how to incorporate music into the worship services. If you have vocal or instrumental offerings you'd like to share, please contact Heidi.

This is an exciting, cautious time for our congregation. If you feel safe in doing so, come join us in worshiping our risen Lord in this season of Pentecost. As always, stay faithful, stay safe, stay well and continue to pray for our planet, country and community.

Milnor Lutheran Council Meeting Minutes

May 26th, 2020 @ 7 p.m. (conference call)

Present: Andrea Hogness, Don Nelson, Randy Syrstad, Diane Wallin, Travers Storhaug, Myron Yagow & Alisha Olson; Absent:Kelly Arth, Lonnie Rotenberger & Rick Bryant

Approval of Meeting Minutes from March 10thand

May 5th: Motion to approve from Randy, Alisha seconded, all in favor

Treasurer's Report for March & April: Motion to approve from Diane, Alisha seconded, all in favor

Main Discussion of Re-Opening:

- When to reopen?
 - Council had wanted to give it the month of May & revisit using county positive case numbers as part of the decision factor. There have been 3 cases diagnosed & all 3 are recovered (as of date of meeting)
 - Immanuel has been going well; they have offering plate & bulletins in the back
 - Catholic Church in Milnor started 3 weeks ago & going well-doing additional cleaning & wearing masks
 - Gwinner is only doing drive-in services through the summer
- Precautions discussed:
 - Decision was made to resume in person service starting on June 7th
 - Discussions were had on havinga projector • type service instead of bulletins and get the entire service including hymns on a Word or PPT document. We would need to get a copyright license for this which is \$200 for an annual license to avoid copyright violations. Discussion was held and because of the most recent CDC guidelines, decision was made to continue with bulletins and hymnals which will be placed in narthex with sticky notes for congregation members to 'check outlibrary style' and put by their reserved spot in the pew so both church spaces & hymnal books can be reserved each week
 - No fellowship following church
 - No sharing of the peace (by shaking hands)
 - No greeters or ushers

- We will see if Rick could put a brick in front of the door while people are entering & he would close after the service starts. Use only main entrance door (members do not use other doors to enter)
- Diane will reach out to the shepherding group leaders to let them know that we only need a reader at this time. If they are unable to obtain a reader, Rick will request a volunteer at service, read himself, or have congregation read silently
- Communion will be discussed again at a later date, there is too much risk at this time with serving communion
- Don will reach out to Barb about additional cleaning in the sanctuary and bathrooms after each service. Since there will be no fellowship, no cleaning needed in fellowship hall
- The council will check if we can make masks available for members to use but due to high demand, we will need to encourage members to bring their own.
- Travers will check with Gordy's to see if we can get pre hand sanitizer, but again members are encouraged to bring their own
- Social distancing guidelines apply
- Members are encouraged to select their spot at church and put a hymnal with stick note by their spot to reserve that space
- Hands should be washed thoroughly
- June Newsletter to go out with above guidelines

 - Confirmation & First Communion Will wait to see how starting services back up goes and keep discussing. It will happen, it's just a matter of when! Reformation Sunday was mentioned as possibility which is at the end of October
- Properties/Grounds/Parsonage (Myron, Travers, Don)
 - Parsonage sewer bill will be in soon
 - Parsonage Yard next steps will be discussed at next meeting after some rock is removed
 - Church mowing is being done by Linkoln Smith. Due to COVID-19 and sewer expenses, Linkoln has offered to donate his time to the church this year for mowing. Council is very appreciative but has suggested that he keep track of how many times he mows so that we can still pay him at the end of the year as we know more about our expenses.

Volunteer Needed


The Council is looking for a volunteer to sand and paint the outside trim around the stained glass windows at the back of the sanctuary. If you can help, please contact the church office or a Council member.
