

Who is ready for some good news? The shower unit has arrived! This was the missing puzzle piece to the bathroom project. Now our crews can get back to work.

To bring you up to date on project finances, currently there is \$11,510.01 in the fund. \$3,130.24 has been paid, mainly for materials. Our larger bills will come as work resumes. We appreciate all the generous donations already received. If you would like to contribute in a more personal way, you can sponsor a bathroom accessory in memory of or in honor of someone special. The Milnor Lutheran WELCA met Mons, May 17 at 20:00 AM with 8 members present. The meeting was called to order by President, Dorothy Pribula. The secretary's report was read and approved. The treasurer's report was given with a balance of \$3800.00.

Old Business:

The Love Offering envelopes have been mailed and are due June 1. There are 9 students eligible to attend this year. There may be students from the Methodist church also wanting to attend. Red Willow is finding it difficult to hire high school and college aged counselors and may be using Jr High age students to fill these positions. Some parents have expressed concern about this, as these student counselors would be the same age as their child. Donna Johnson is collecting a list of those able to attend and will ask parents if they would like to wait and send their child along with next year's class. Money from the Love Offering would be saved for this purpose next year.

A mail slot was installed in the office door by Bill Pribula.

A \$3000 pledge had been made by WELCA for the parsonage bathroom project in 2019. A \$500 portion was given to the parsonage storage shed project last summer. Donna Johnson will talk to Grace Prante to let her know that WELCA is able to pay up to \$2500 on the bathroom project if needed.

New Business:

WELCA will contribute to summer bible camp if funding is needed.

Flower pots are needing to be planted at church. Patty Ellefson volunteered to plant the pots and Kristie Johnson offered to water them throughout the summer. WELCA will purchase the flowers.

It was decided to have the Fall Bazaar this year. Dates were discussed and Sun., Oct.10 was chosen as the desired date with Sun., Oct., 24 an alternate date. It's not sure if we can hire Dale Haugen as auctioneer because he has retired, but Dorothy Pribula will see if he's willing. If the auction is not possible, a silent auction might be an option.

Linda Costain made a suggestion to have the soup and sandwich luncheon closer to noon, after church, instead of the evening event. Everyone seemed interested in trying this idea. The quilt will be sewn by Bobbi Haugen.

It was also decided to host the Christmas Tea this year. Patty Ellefson will contact Jana Sipe Berndt from Breckenridge to be our guest speaker. She is an author and her message is on rediscovering joy thru a season of loss.

Dorothy has purchased gifts from WELCA to give for those church members getting married.

The Eastern ND Women of the ELCA annual meeting will be held Saturday, Sept. 18 at the Park River Bible Camp. Guest speaker will be Kevin Wallevand. The topic is Immigration and Children in Crisis. Registration is due Aug., 15. Contact Dorothy if interested in attending. Officers are needed on the Synod Board and must apply by July 20. Again, contact Dorothy if interested. Yarn is needed for the Prison Ministry Collection Project. Donations can be brought to the convention in September or given to the James River Correctional Center. Items made with the yarn donations will be given to homeless shelters.

Sunday School bags (59) have been sewn for Lutheran World Relief and need to have cords inserted. A list of school supplies will be listed in the bulletin and newsletter this summer and assembled. There could be other projects WELCA could do in future years instead of the school bags including Personal Care Kits or Baby Kits. We will decide later if one of these others projects will be started next year.

Linda Costain gave a report on Darrell Costain's Furniture Mission. He collects furniture and household items to give to needy families in the Fargo area. It was discussed and decided this could be a project for WELCA. We could collect items and take to Fargo once we find out their specific needs.

Senior Recognition Sunday is May 23. Day of Doing will give quilts to the graduates.

Our next meeting is scheduled for Mon., September 13th at 10:00 AM.

IMMANUEL LUTHERAN COUNCIL MINUTES

June 16, 2021

The Immanuel Lutheran Council met June 16th, 2021 at Immanuel Lutheran Church. Present were Pastor Bryant, Brenda Gibbon, Jim Berndt, Derek Martinson, Joel Halverson, and Landon Mund.

Joel called the meeting to order. The Secretary's report was read. Motion to accept was made by Derek, seconded by Jim, motion carried. Derek gave the treasurer's report. All but a couple small budget items are paid, and we have a \$19,128.93 balance on hand. Brenda made a motion to accept the Treasurer's report, seconded by Landon, motion carried.

Pastor Rick spoke about exploring week-long intensive courses for his ordination and about the work he has put in landscaping at the Parsonage.

Old business included a brief discussion on the Church's shed. Arlin is heading a committee and searching for a carpenter. The project is up in the air. Larry is still trying to connect with Crossroads on fixing the lights in the Church. The council decided to check back with him.

The council voted in favor of having 8am service until September. Brenda made a motion to accept, seconded by Jim, motion carried.

Lastly, the Pancake Supper is planned for September 12th. Derek made a motion to accept, seconded by Landon, motion carried.

New business included a discussion on the Church's donations and allocating some funds to the Abuse Resource Network. Discussions were tabled for the time being.

The council also voted for no church service on July 4th and 18th. Brenda made a motion to accept, seconded by Jim, motion carried.

The next meeting will be held Wednesday, August 18th. We closed with the Lord's Prayer.
